ifelong learning, the acquisition of skills, and access to jobs are the cornerstones of fairer and more sustainable economic and social development (Sustainable Development Goals 4 and 8).

In 2021, AFD has continued to work to respond to the needs of its partner countries, which have been greatly affected by the Covid-19 pandemic. This health crisis has exacerbated already severe inequalities in access to, and the quality of education. In the medium term, the crisis will not only roll back the advances made in school enrollment (especially of girls) in the 2000s and 2010s, but it will also jeopardize improvement in the basic and professional skills of young people entering the labor force in the 2020s.

This is why education requires massive global investment.

AFD-financed actions in education, training, and employment have also contributed to the other Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) notably by promoting the following:

Gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls (SDG 5)

 Reduction of inequalities within and between countries (SDG 10)

Support for a fair environmental transition (SDG 13)

Partnerships between governments, the private sector and civil society (SDG 17) *م* ′

AFD's strategy in Education-Training-Employment

• Lifelong learning and skills acquisition and access to jobs are the cornerstones of sustainable economic and social development.

■ This is why AFD finances **the entire educational spectrum and facilitates synergies between the various types of education, training, and employment** (i.e., primary and secondary education, higher education, vocational training, integration into the labor market through employment, and entrepreneurship).

■ AFD has devoted **€4.3 billion to this sector since 2000**, with a strong focus on Africa (85% of the portfolio) AFD's financing activity to the sector has undergone sustained growth since 2010, as well as a profound diversification of financing tools and methods (e.g., delegated funds, public-policy loans and pooled funds, grants).

Vocational training

Basic education

AFD works to make access to basic education universal, especially for middle school, and promotes improvement in the quality of teaching and learning. Our support focuses mainly on our partner countries' national policies, especially in the least developed countries, with emphasis on the enrollment of girls and youth from the most vulnerable populations. It also focuses on the professionalization of teachers, and on effective management of education systems.

Project focus



Helping the education system cope with crises (the "REVE" project)

Niger

US \$7.5 M in delegated funds from the Global Partnership for Education (GPE)

This project supports Niger's national strategy to reduce vulnerabilities in its education system. It entails the setting up of a specific cartography to identify priority areas in terms of multiple vulnerabilities (security, food security, health vulnerabilities, education, etc.) in extremely fine detail. This tool, based on existing data, will enable its adoption by the Nigerien Ministry of Education as well as the introduction of a permanent system that prioritizes resource allocation.

The project helps meet the needs of the most vulnerable towns and villages affected by crises and to strengthen the resilience of the education system. The management committees of 6,615 schools in 150 towns and villages will receive grants enabling them to set up crisis preparedness and response actions and to strengthen the quality of the school environment as well as teaching and learning. The project will make it possible to enroll 20,000 students, including at least 12,000 girls. Capacity building will be provided to teachers and principals of schools in crisis, and the towns and villages will be supported in monitoring the school actions.

Vocational training

AFD works to develop diversified training opportunities that promote lifelong learning and respond to the needs of the labor market. We support the design and implementation of comprehensive training strategies, such as in the agricultural and rural sectors. We also have actors in the business world playing a role in the governance of training programs. Special attention is paid to developing the skills needed to create green jobs and to the environmental transition.

Project focus

The "New Chance" project





The "New Chance" project (Dispositif Nouvelle Chance - DNC) focuses on the employability, training, and professional integration of young people aged 18 to 30 who have failed at school or dropped out. It was designed in close collaboration with the Tunisian Ministry of Employment and Vocational Training.

DNC promotes professional integration via individualized programs consisting of periods that alternate between immersion in business and high-level personalized support. The project will last three years and directly benefit 1,000 young people.

It will help create a pilot system for young people who have dropped out of school and who currently have no way of finding professional employment, thereby improving their economic and social situation.

The operational management of DNC will be carried out by the National Agency for Employment and Self-employment as part of a partnership agreement with the European Institute for Cooperation and Development (IECD), which is responsible for implementation of the project.

Higher education and scientific research

AFD promotes equitable access to higher education of good quality that leads to professionalization and boosts innovation. Our goals are to a) enhance the sustainability and governance of higher education and scientific research; b) improve the quality of the training available and make it more relevant; and c) support the continuity between higher education, research, innovation and entrepreneurship.

Project focus

Support Project for the Professionalization of Higher Education (PAPES)

Niger €10 M

The goal of PAPES is to facilitate the employability and socio-economic integration of young Nigerien women and men by promoting professionalization in higher education. It will focus on improving the quality of short professional courses in line with the country's development priorities and on strengthening the involvement of socio-professional circles in drawing up and approving the PAPES programs. The project will also help work to build a technical-pedagogical platform in agri-food (the "PTPA" in French), aimed at professionalizing and developing this promising sector. The PTPA will target both academic and socio-professional circles via initial and continuing training as well as through project innovation and incubation. Another important aspect of PAPES is that it helps puts into action the commitment by French President Emmanuel Macron (made in Ouagadougou, Burkina Faso in 2017) to double university partnerships with Africa.

Employment

AFD promotes the development of labor market policies, access by individuals, and by women in particular, to employment and entrepreneurship, improvement in job quality, and the employability of people in vulnerable situations.

AFD Group supports the job-creating private sector through its subsidiary Proparco. Additionally, our work seeks to strengthen not only the financial systems and regulatory environment of companies, but also social protection.

Support project for the development of entrepreneurship in Mauritania, targeting women in particular

Mauritania €9 M grant

AFD is supporting technical education, vocational training, and public policies on youth employment in Mauritania.

This grant will support the Mauritanian government in its financial and non-financial support for business project leaders. Entrepreneurship in Mauritania is a strategic lever for generating jobs for young people, and women in particular. A total of 1,000 companies and 3,000 jobs will be created throughout the country. More broadly, the project will strengthen the support system for youth entrepreneurship launched by the government in 2020, notably taking gender into account.

Partnerships and networking

A highlight of 2021 was AFD's mobilization and participation in the Global Education Summit (the replenishment conference of the GPE), during which France renewed its commitment to the sector.

The AFD and the Global Partnership for Education (GPE) partnership: a major strategic asset for our position



The GPE is the only multilateral development actor exclusively dedicated to financing education in developing countries. Its donors, developing countries, civil society and multilateral organizations are all involved in its governance. France is the third largest donor in the current cycle (US \$333 million for the 2021-2025 period).

AFD is currently the third largest executor of GPE delegated funds, amounting to approximately €322 million in five countries (Senegal, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Niger, Guinea).





AFD and the GPE enjoy a relationship of trust, with the GPE recognizing AFD's sectoral expertise and added value, especially through our:

Alignment with partner country strategies and procedures

Ability to propose specific assistance to back up national systems

■ Ability to connect regional expertise platforms (e.g., UNESCO IIPE, PASEC, APPRENDRE, ELAN) and national needs on key aspects of the sector, such as support for teachers, bilingual teaching, and systems management
