e have now entered the 'age of consequences': long, slow-moving crises such as climate change, whose effects are accelerating, and the major health, economic, and geopolitical shocks that may ensue as a result. Understanding the circumstances and analyzing long-term trends are essential for improving the quality of our operations and their impact using a country-specific approach.

This is the purpose of the studies and research carried out by AFD using a multi-disciplinary approach, in close collaboration with our partners in the Global South. This approach can be used to foster public policy dialogue as well as civic debate. Overlapping several Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), research at AFD is grounded in the strong sustainability approach: it recognizes the interdependence of economic, environmental, and social transition trajectories, as well as the importance of involving citizens in shaping societal priorities related to these transitions – that are specific for each country.

This Studies and Research 2022 report lays out AFD Group's main trends for this work in terms of volume and topical, geographical, and partnership priorities, highlighting the main uses and flagship projects of our five signature approaches.

AFD Group's strategy for studies and research

Our strategy for studies and research is in line with the priorities of AFD's Strategy. Divided into five signature approaches, it emphasizes public policy dialogue and research in the Global South.

Strong sustainability: a new area of research for AFD

AFD uses the concept of strong sustainability to shed new light on building development trajectories. Three principles are proposed to guide decision-makers in building trajectories that takes into account social and planetary boundaries, as well as macroeconomic constraints:

- 1. Non-substitutability between different types of capital (natural, economic, and social).
- **2.** Production of multi-dimensional, science-based indicators and analyses.
- 3. Collectively defining a new social contract regarding the ideal state of affairs and the trajectories required to reach it.

This approach contributes to the alignment of environmental, societal, and economic knowledge in order to achieve the SDGs and make this compass more effective.



Supporting research in the Global South

chieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) requires mobilizing research to better understand and anticipate sustainable development issues, propose science-based solutions, and inform the choices of decisionmakers. Each country needs robust national research to grasp the specific challenges it faces and build its development agenda. However, research in many of the countries where we work is underfunded and not sufficiently linked to the public debate.

AFD Group supports and assists research in developing countries in various ways:

- by systematically associating local teams to the research projects it funds, as research partners who participate in developing the terms of reference for studies and share the intellectual property for the findings.
- funding research capacity building and networking projects, as well as initiatives to support young researchers.
- producing and disseminating knowledge about research in developing countries, and building on the findings to further improve its own practices.

Strengthening research capacities in the Global South

AFD funds many research capacity building projects in the countries where it operates: Global Africa for creating a multi-disciplinary scientific journal, 'ACE Impact' for developing programs of academic excellence, and PARTNER for creating regional networks and partnerships. AFD also works with the Global Development Network as part of the Clermont-Ferrand International Development Hub project.

Citizen dialogue is key to re-greening Madagascar

The Alamino initiative, coordinated by the Malagasy NGO Indri, aims to restore forest cover and to re-green the country's landscapes. It has identified ten principles for re-greening the island as well as strategic fire management measures. Citizen dialogue is key to this initiative: more than 200 organizations are involved, and there is a strong commitment from local communities and the Ministry of the Environment and Sustainable Development.

Transitions in Overseas France: challenges and visions for the future

The 7th AFD-CEROM conference on Overseas France was held on October 13, 2022, after the first ARUM conference (Actes de la recherche ultramarine). Its theme was broken down into four sessions devoted to agri-food, energy and socio-economic transitions in Overseas France, as well as monitoring and steering tools.

There were 522 participants online and 150 in person.





Finance in Common: a look at the research conference

Held in October 2022 in Abidjan, this conference highlighted:

- the role of public development banks (PDBs) as the financial arm of governments to support public policies.
- their role in the global financial structure.
- the alignment of PDBs with the Paris Agreement and the 2030 Agenda.
- the role of African PDBs as an essential link to social inclusion.

In addition, as an extension of AFD's collaboration with Peking University, the database of PDBs around the world has been updated to include financial data on 528 institutions and to map their public policy objectives.
