PeA is a programme for academia partnerships between Africa and France. It is financed by the French Ministry for Europe and Foreign Affairs via the Agence française de développement (AFD). The programme is implemented by the Agence nationale de la recherche (ANR – French National Research Agency) and Campus France with support from the French Ministry of Higher Education and Research. It reflects the political will of France to double the number of partnerships between African and French higher education institutions.



Launched in 2020, the goal of this

A long-term strategic partnership for higher education programmes delivered in Africa: Licence/Bachelor, Master and Doctorate/PhD programmes that are job-oriented, attractive and of high quality.
