



2050 FACILITY

The 2050 Facility is a grant tool offering technical assistance and capacity building activities. It supports AFD partner countries in their transition to low-carbon development models that are more resilient to the consequences of climate change and preserve the environment.

The Facility has a total budget of €40 million, to be used by 2027.





Support countries in developing and implementing long-term, low-carbon and resilient development strategies.

Equip them for investment planning and climate finance mobilization.

Strengthen the capacity of actors to build transition trajectories based on the socioeconomic objectives of the country.

- Development of long-term strategies under the Paris Agreement
- Modelling of sectoral trajectories (including for energy, agriculture and forests) and multisectoral trajectories
- Socio-economic assessment of low-carbon transition scenarios and climate change impacts
- Analysis of country vulnerability, transition risks, biodiversity loss
- Sectoral studies on social impacts and transition
 opportunities across the value chain
- Support for the planning and development of sectoral roadmaps in relation to countries' climate action and biodiversity protection plans
- Support for governance mechanisms that promote accountability and transparency in the monitoring of national commitments



Colombia (€900 K): With the Colombian authorities and Expertise France, support for the development of the low-carbon and resilient development strategy for 2050, subject to the United Nations Framework Convention.



Vietnam (€1 M): In partnership with the authorities, Vietnamese research centres and the IRD, an integrated study on the socio-economic impacts of climate change and possible adaptation strategies.
